# Eradication Of Helicobacter Pylori After Failure Of First Line Therapy

Following the Maastricht III consensus, the first line therapy advocated for Helicobacter pylori has been seven days of a proton pump inhibitor with clarithromycin and either amoxicillin or metronidazole. However, with bacterial resistance rates of up to 20% for clarithromycin and 40% for metronidazole, the eradication rate has dropped to 70-85%.

In addition, failure to eradicate H pylori has also been ascribed to cytochrome 2C19 polymorphism for the metabolism of proton pump inhibitors in a small percentage of patients. In this circumstance, Rabeprazole metabolism appears to be least affected by this enzyme polymorphism.

#### Therefore what other treatment options are available for eradication?


A quadruple therapy regimen of Bismuth, a proton pump inhibitor, tetracycline and metronidazole has an eradication rate of up 80% after first line treatment failure on an intention to treat analysis. However, tetracycline and bismuth are not now registered drugs in Australia and need to be formulated at a compounding pharmacy.

Another quadruple therapy regimen including a proton pump inhibitor, amoxicillin, clarithromycin and metronidazole may achieve an eradication rate of up to

A study from Italy has suggested that a first line sequential regimen of five days of a proton pump inhibitor with amoxicillin followed by five days of a proton pump inhibitor with clarithromycin and tinidazole may achieve

an eradication rate of 90% on an intention to treat analysis.

Alternatively a first line regimen with high dose rabeprazole and amoxicillin achieved an eradication rate of 88% on an intention to treat analysis.



Helicobacter Pylori

Some authors have suggested that prolonging the course of therapy may increase eradication rates, although this is currently unclear.

Third line regimens including a fluoroquinilone, rifabutin or furazolidone may achieve an eradication rate of up to 70%.

Finally compliance should be always be considered with treatment failure as the gastrointestinal side effects of therapy may compel the patient to discontinue therapy and thus it is worth warning the patient of this.
